

1,464 students in preliminary round of ComQuiz

PETALING JAYA: A total of 1,464 students here and in Ipoh took part in the preliminary fround of the ComQuiz 2002, which is jointly organised by The Star and Inti College.

Before 10am, participants started to pack the registration counter at Inti College in Subang Jaya and at SMJK Yuk "Choy in Ipoh for the one-and-ahalf-hour contest that began at 11am yesterday.

Chong Tat Keong said the school entered only one team but hoped that it would encourage other students to cultivate an interest in computers.

Only four teams will emerge from a total of 488 teams from 175 schools nationwide in this 12th competition to enter the final round, which will be held at Inti International College in Penang on Aug 17, and a total of 16 top scholars will also be selected from each state.

The annual competition, open to Form Three, Four and Five students, is aimed at encouraging students to be more information technology savvy and preparing them for future IT-based working life.

Prizes for the winning teams include a challenge trophy, personal computers, printers, scanners and learning aid kits while the team members will receive a plaque, Inti College scholarships and books.
